




## Sunday Mornings in Lent Book Discussion ~ Continues thru April 2

Perhaps walk with this week's question: "How do I welcome the poor and the vulnerable?" To welcome someone means to show them hospitality-warmth, kindness, courtesy and generosity. These are matters of the heart. Walk with an open heart-

releasing as you walk to the center, receiving as you stand in the center - this week receive a candle to remind you to welcome someone and then return as you are meant to be-shine your light as you walk back to the beginning and back into the world. Also visit **this week's prayer station** to reflect on the ways of forgiveness.
